Chain of Sharing

"Return home and tell how much God has done for you. So the man went away and told all over town how much Jesus had done for him." Luke 8:39

The Scripture above is one of my favorite statements of Jesus. This comes from part of the story of salvation about a demonpossessed person. Jesus did not waste a second as soon as he saw him. Jesus wanted him to be free, to be healed, and to be able to reintegrate himself back into the community. What comes after is a testament of compassion from Jesus. He uses his authority to bring healing and freedom to the man. If I was he, I would probably have liked to do exactly what this man wanted after he was healed: follow Jesus. However, Jesus told him something very specific, "Return home and tell how much God has done for you," and he did.

Sharing our story about Jesus has a powerful result for our lives and for the lives of others. Can you imagine the many people that this man touched through his witness? Maybe you and I are here because somehow a person who listened to that man shared about Jesus; as a result the chain of sharing has gone all the way until 2020 in San Antonio, Texas.

So what is your story? What can we share with the world about "how much God has done for us?"

My story is about the power of answered prayers from the Lord:

My Mom prayed at age 5 saying "Jesus I want to find you," and when she was 53, she was able to receive Jesus as her Lord and Savior. This relationship is sustaining her now in the midst of challenging times.

When I was 6 years old, I had my first communion as a Roman Catholic member. I told the Lord, "I want you to be my friend, and I want to know you better." Since then, He has conquered my heart with His love, and His grace is always present in my life with the evidence of my abundant mistakes and weaknesses. My Dad said a prayer that he never changed and that he prayed before every meal: Lord bless the food that we are going to eat. May it nurture us to continue in your service until the end of our days. Amen." This was the reality of his life, to serve the Lord ... until the last day of his life.

"Give us our daily bread" is a real statement in my life, especially in my younger years. Food and other resources were limited. However, we learned that all that we had, which was not a lot, came from the Lord. We learned that He is the provider and that tithing was not my gift to God but the way in which to remember that God is the one who provides for us.

I hope and pray that God can use both your story and mine. I hope that through our stories, God will tell us to "return home" and share our experiences with Him with our coworkers, schools, neighbors, etc... so that they can also experience the love of Christ.

May 2020 be the year for us to receive from the Lord His love and grace. May we all be fulfilled through His love. May we all be empowered to *return home and tell how much God has done for you.*



Pastor Patrick's Page




A few members have asked me about my doctoral program. Three years ago, I graduated with my Doctorate of Ministry from Midwestern Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri. My focus was church leadership. I chose to study leadership inside the church, because I believe that leadership is one way in which the church can become healthier. My focus for my dissertation was on the leadership of parents and children to each other while working through a Bible study together. From five years of study that my two years of dissertation work, one truth that I discovered is, intergenerational ministry is a key component of the church.

I will not bore you with the details of my dissertation (even I find it a little tedious), but I will tell you this: I believe the family is a key way that the gospel moves. Moreover, I believe the family itself is patterned after God. In God, we have God the father, God the son, and God the Holy Spirit. Father of course takes on the fatherly role: the rule maker, the rule enforcers, the benign loving dictator. Jesus takes on the role of the son or the children: being born an innocent child, growing in the areas of life, and fulfilling his calling in favor with God's favor with man. I believe the Holy Spirit takes on the role of the mother: the keeper, the advisor, the one who takes care of the needs. Please do not see these descriptions of traditional family roles as a mandate, but merely an explanation. My nuclear family does not fall into these strict roles; Stephanie makes most of the rules in our home.

Because of this knowledge and belief in family ministry, I value intergenerational ministry. One of my favorite things to see on Sunday morning is a family sitting together, worshiping together, and praying together. It means something to me that children and their parents are learning the same thing at the same time. It's the perfect place and time to model to each other. I believe so many intangibles and unmeasurable are communicated by just worshiping and serving the Lord together.

One of the reasons I value Northern Hills is that it values family. It's a place that values teaching the ways of Jesus. This includes fathers, mothers and grandparents teaching children and teens their spiritual heritage.

"Y'all saved my life" said a young man who was sitting in the lobby of the Ministry Center. I had seen him many times before, while he was waiting for his bus in the afternoons. We would greet him, and he was always polite but not very talkative. Every now and then he would ask if we had a snack bag available.

So, when he said "Y'all saved my life," it caught me by surprise. He went on to say: "Don't you remember? Y'all called EMS for me when I was in a very bad place. I was really sick and y'all made sure they got me to the hospital." At that moment, I remembered that in June a homeless young man, who occasionally came for a snack bag, stumbled into the Ministry Center. He was very ill, and we decided to call EMS.

When the paramedics arrived, there was some hesitation on whether he should go to the hospital or not. We insisted that he be taken, and we later learned from others that his condition was serious enough to warrant a longer stay. I realized that this was the same young man, but he had changed so much that I did not recognize him.

He said, "Pastor I have been clean for 6 months, I have a job and I'm getting a car soon. My life is back on track and thank y'all for saving my life." We praised God for his new life and brighter future. As I thought about this young man and the timing of our conversation, I don't think it was a coincidence that he chose to remind us of

his experience on our first day of 2020.



Most of the time we will never know what kind of impact our ministries have on others, but occasionally God gives us a snapshot that can be shared. When this young man used the word y'all, it resonated with me. To him, y'all means all of us, y'all means our church, and y'all means Christ's disciples.

Y'all are saving lives, not just figuratively, but to this man, y'all literally saved his life. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Christ in the community in so many ways. Our presence in the community is making an impact. Everything you do in service for the Lord makes an impact. Even the small things like providing a snack bag for someone who is hungry is offering hospitality, that can open a door and that can save a life.

Thank you for allowing Christ to work through you!


