What are some of your family traditions? Do you have "Taco Tuesday" or Saturday "River Walk" walk? Traditions bring to a family a sense of unity and meaning. Through that, it clarifies the identity of that family.

How is that service going to unfold? We will continue in living under the mission of our church that is to Reach others for Jesus, Teach the ways of Jesus and Love the world for which Jesus died, so that God is glorified through His Son."

What are our tactics?

Radical Hospitality – We will have a heart for welcoming people not just inside of the building, but wherever we go. We want to be known as the people who takes the church outside of the building. Matthew 10:40

Love Everyone – Everyone means "all y'all" in the world. No exceptions. No limitations. No exclusions. We all were loved; therefore, we all can love. John 15:12

Challenge Everyone — As family in Christ, we come to this place as imperfect people in need to growth. We pray that NHUMC is a space where each of us can be vulnerable and open to allow the Spirit of God lead us and challenge us to confront areas where we need to mature. Romans 12: 2

Disciple – Jesus invites us to be his witnesses. What do we witness? We witness what we have become through Jesus and how we belong to the body of Christ, the Church. Through that action, we disciple. By telling others what the presence of the Lord has done in our lives, we witness, we disciple. Acts 1:8

What is our prayer?

Our prayer is as a Spanish Christian Song says: "One day at a time my Christ, give me the strength to live, one day at a time" ("Un día a la vez mi Cristo, dame la fuerza para vivir un día a la vez")






FAREWELL PASTOR MILTON


THE TIME OF MY DEPARTURE HAS COME

When Paul said those words (2 Timothy 4:6), he was referring to his imminent death. He was referring to the end of his life. When I say those words today, I am referring to the end of my career in active ordained ministry and the end of my 30-year run as senior pastor of Northern Hills. This is an emotional time for me. I have deep love for The United Methodist Church and for NHUMC especially. I have been here to baptize babies and later to officiate at their weddings and then to baptize their children. That's a long run. We have been through so many ups and downs together, I wouldn't know where to begin to chronicle them, nor which ones to chronicle. I have much fulfillment, and I have some regrets. That's life. And now that the time of my departure has come, I plan to continue living fully and to embrace fully this new season known as "retirement."

A retired pastor's advice was, "Now you go from being an ordained minister to being a disciple." I get that. I am still ordained, and I may yet perform some of the functions of the ordained, but my primary identity now is not that of pastor but that of disciple. Now I ask myself, "What does it mean to follow?" "What is Jesus teaching me?" "Where and to whom is Jesus leading me?" Of course, I've always asked myself those questions but with application to my position as a pastor and spiritual leader. Now I ask them as an ordinary person, an ordinary follower, and I am eager to discern the answers.



John Fehlauer said that in his retirement he was determined to do three things: (1) have fun; (2) give back; and (3) learn/do some-



What a tremendous congregation you are! Thank you for your support through the years. SUMMER IS HERE!

A time for fun, travel and activities for most of us. While many churches take a break from activities during this season, this is a very busy time at the Ministry Center, as we host Project Transformation (P.T.) for a third year. This reading-focused summer camp provides a variety of fun and educational activities to children from lower-income families in our community.

By the time this article is published, P.T. will be in full swing. Our P.T. interns will be mentoring the 75 plus children enrolled in the program. Our first "Family Fun Night" will have been planned and ready to go. Volunteers will have already started reading with the children, and our "Welcome Team" will have been providing hospitality to the P.T. families.

Our volunteers find that serving in this program is especially rewarding because they have a direct and positive impact on the children of our community. Last year, 97% of the children who were enrolled in P.T. increased or maintained their reading level (up from 93% the previous year). This program works and has a long and lasting impact on our children's lives.



Last year I provided the following statistics from San Antonio Youth Literacy, and it is worth sharing again:

- Research shows that young children who are not fluent readers by the end of 3rd grade may never catch up with their peers.
- 1 in 6 children who are not reading proficiently in 3rd grade do not graduate from high school on time. That is a rate that is 4 times greater than that of proficient readers.
- In San Antonio, every 4 minutes a student drops out.
- 40% of Bexar county inmates do not have a high school diploma.
- 68% of people who are arrested for all crimes in the U.S. are illiterate.

These alarming statistics remind us of how important it is to focus on helping our children to read well.

That is why we provide and support programs that encourage literacy for children and adults. In addition to Project Transformation, we have an after-school program at the Ministry Center and a homework-help program at local apartment complexes. We support the "Reading Buddy" programs at local elementary schools and provide English as a Second Language classes throughout the community.

I encourage you to consider volunteering for one of these literacy programs. It will be one of the most rewarding activities you will experience this year.
